TIMELINE

- TALK TO YOUR LOCAL STOR-X REPRESENTATIVE**
Or even an interior designer will be able to help put all your ideas together better. They take in all items to be considered to create an optimized and functional kitchen to meet your needs!
- APPLY FOR BUILDING PERMITS**
Building permits are often required for structural, plumbing, mechanical and electrical alterations to a house. If you have hired a contractor, they should take care of the permitting.
- FINALIZE YOUR PLANS AND PLACE ORDERS**
Make a list of what company will be coming in to do what part, set dates and order appliances, cabinets, flooring, lighting, hardware etc.
- ESTABLISH A TEMPORARY KITCHEN**
Pack up all your valuables to store in a safe place and be sure to have a fridge and microwave handy, or an outdoor grill in the meantime.
- DEMOLISH KITCHEN**
Once you have received and inspected all parts, it is time to start the demo! If you are doing it yourself be sure to plan of how to dispose of the waste.
- STRUCTURAL CHANGES**
This is the time for removing or adding walls, windows, or doorways!
- PLUMBING, MECHANICAL AND ELECTRICAL WORK**
Utility rough-in work needs to be completed before any drywall and flooring are installed. Don't forget to schedule their return when it is time to install the appliances.
- INSTALL DRYWALL AND PAINT**
Prep, prime and paint any surfaces that can be completed before installing flooring.
- INSTALL FLOORING**
Tile and hardwood, should be installed before cabinetry. But floating floor types, like luxury vinyl flooring and laminates, can be installed after the cabinets.
- INSTALL CABINETS**
- MEASURE, FABRICATE AND INSTALL COUNTERTOPS**
- INSTALL BACKSPLASH**
- GET YOUR APPLIANCES INSTALLED**
Some appliances require more complicated steps to connect them. When purchasing your appliance check with the supplier if they offer an installer to help with getting it connected, if you know your contractor is unable to.
- FINISHING TOUCHES**
Cabinet hardware, crown molding, paint touch-ups, electrical outlet covers and any other details like double checking the appliances and its connections. Be sure to test all appliances for leaks and that each one is working correctly before paying the contractor in full.
